

The sessions were interactive and 57 students participated from 3rd semester. There was two sessions and the afternoon session were of interactive participation with model building.

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










Being the practicing psychologist and counsellor Rev. Dr. Sebastian Cheripurth clarified the confusions related to the counselling and its role in the MBA professionals.


Feedback on the Program

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


Overall Impact of the Program








Learning and Motivation Aspect of the Program
